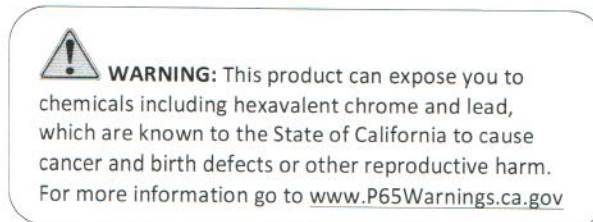
The California Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986, commonly known as "Proposition 65," requires manufacturers to provide a warning label on products that may contain chemicals on the State of California's Prop 65 list. In August 2016, the Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment (OEHHA) adopted new Prop 65 regulations that become effective August 30, 2018. **The new Prop 65 regulations include changes to the requirements for warning label language and use. These changes address not only the labeling of product packaging, but also the requirements for warnings on website landing pages and catalog pages used to sell products to consumers in California.**

Delta Faucet Company Prop 65 Warning Label

Delta Faucet Company will be updating the labeling of our products as required to meet the new requirements of Proposition 65. Delta Faucet Company will continue to use the following court-approved "clear and reasonable warning" label on packaging for Delta®, Brizo® and Peerless® showers, tub fillers, bidets, toilets, accessories and select repair parts (RPs) that require the Prop 65 label:



We are allowed to use this label for certain products that were within the scope of a prior court-approved settlement. The new regulations allow the continued use of this language as a "clear and reasonable warning." In addition, other Delta, Brizo and Peerless products may contain alternate labels in accordance with the new regulations as shown in the example below:



Even though a product may be found to contain a Proposition 65-listed chemical, it does not mean that use of the product will cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. Nor does it mean that a product is unsafe. **All Delta Faucet Company products meet or exceed the requirements of applicable product performance and safety industry standards, as well as the federal Safe Drinking Water Act.** We are confident there is no health hazard associated with the installation, use or removal of our products.

Delta Faucet Company Prop 65-Labeled Products

Delta, Brizo and Peerless models that require the Prop 65 label are identified in the product list posted on deltafaucet.com/CA. This list also indicates the appropriate Prop 65 label for each product. California Prop 65-labeled products and the relevant labels will be identified in the Delta, Brizo and Peerless price files in the future.


What These Changes Mean for Delta Faucet Company Customers

If you intend to sell Prop 65-labeled products in California, the labeling requirement will apply for internet and catalog purchases. Customers should use the product-appropriate Delta Faucet Company label to identify Delta, Brizo and Peerless products that require a Prop 65 warning. The product-appropriate warning label(s) may be downloaded on deltafaucet.com/CA.
